



Catholic Man of the Month

Gabriel Rosset (1904-1974)

WHEN A TEACHER in Lyon, France, learned of the alarmingly high number of homeless men dying under the city's bridges after World War II, he felt called to act. The apostolate he co-founded — Notre-Dame des Sans-Abri (Our Lady of the Homeless) — continues to serve thousands of people in need today.

Gabriel Rosset was born in Champier, a commune in southeastern France. An exceptional student, he became a literature teacher at age 24. Most of his 40-year teaching career was spent at the Lycée Alexandre Lacassagne in Lyon, where he later received the Legion of Honor award for education in 1965.


As a young man, Rosset often joined other Catholic teachers and university students for fellowship and prayer. This led him and two friends to consecrate themselves to the Lord on July 24, 1937, with the goal of "serving the university and bringing our students back to Christ." They would later take private vows of poverty, chastity and obedience.

In the late 1940s, Lyon suffered an acute housing crisis, and many displaced men died from exposure.



Moved by their misery, Rosset began to distribute blankets to men on the street and even welcome some into his home. On Christmas Eve 1950, he and a team of volunteers established the first Our Lady of the Homeless shelter in an abandoned bistro. Three years later, Rosset moved in with the destitute men he served. "I felt linked to them by a necessity, a bond," he said. "I believe that the mystics, like St. Paul, called that charity."

With the help of students and other volunteers, Rosset established more houses to serve the homeless, including families in need. By his death on Dec. 30, 1974, he had built 1,500 housing units for more than 10,000 people. His cause for canonization was opened in 2006.



THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL- THE EUCHARIST, DID YOU KNOW?

How do doctrines help with understanding our faith? Doctrinal definitions arise when it becomes hard to explain our faith to those who challenge it. So whenever the Church settles on a particular way to "define" what our Christian belief is (this is called a dogma of the faith), then other ways to teach and talk about that article of faith are considered inadequate


For example, the first time that the Church defined a doctrine and determined that other explanations were inadequate was at the first Ecumenical Council at Nicaea near Constantinople in 325 AD. The teacher Arius had tried to explain the divinity of Jesus in a way that challenged the bishops to reexamine how it was expressed.

Arius said that all reality could be divided into two categories: the Creator (that which is not made) and creatures (everything that is made). Form the Bible he concluded that God the Father alone is Creator. Then since all realities had to fit into one of these two categories, he had to put Jesus into the category of creature (although he did note that Jesus was a perfect creature).

But the bishops realized this was not exactly what we believed, and so they defined our true belief (orthodoxy) in the words of the Nicene Creed that we recite each Sunday. Their solution was to recognize that Jesus was neither Creator nor creature but rather a unique reality, "begotten, not made, one in being with the Father." Once they defined our Christian belief this way, the teaching of Arius and anyone who did not accept this dogma was in error. Used with permission from God's Real Presence, by Steve Mueller. 


