





DISPENSATION FOR ST. PATRICK'S DAY, MARCH 17, 2023

Whereas, the disciplinary practice of abstaining from meat on the Fridays in Lent is an important dimension of the penitential nature of the season and applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of fourteen (canons 1251 and 1252); Whereas, this year the Feast of St. Patrick, March 17, falls on a Friday in Lent;

Now therefore, in accord with canon 87 §1 of the Code of Canon Law, given the many celebrations that occur on this day in commemoration of St. Patrick, Principal Patron of the Diocese of Norwich and titular of the Cathedral, I hereby grant to all Catholics of the Diocese of Norwich, as well as all present here that day, a dispensation from abstinence from meat. All who make use of this dispensation are obliged in conscience to undertake another work of charity, exercise of piety, or an act of comparable penance that day.



THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL- THE EUCHARIST, DID YOU KNOW? What does it mean to call this a "substantial" presence? To identify this as a "substantial" presence adopts the substance /accidents terminology used by Medieval Christians theologians like Thomas Aguinas (1225-1274). The terms themselves date back to the Greek philosopher Aristotle (384-322 BC) who was a student of Plato and a teacher of Alexander the Great. He wrote on many different subjects. including physics, metaphysics, poetry, theater, music, logic, rhetoric, politics, government, ethics, biology and zoology. He coined the terms to explain how, for example, a thing could remain what is was essentially (e.g., a dog) and yet have many different characteristics (e.g., a variety of colors, weights types of ears, tails, teeth, etc.). 




Since 2002, the Catholic Church in the U.S.A. has followed a set of rules initiated by the bishops of the country and approved by the Vatican for dealing with sexual abuse of minors by priests or deacons: The Essential Norms for Diocesan/Eparchial Policies Dealing with Allegations of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests or Deacons.

Every U.S. diocese/eparchy is required...

- To have a written policy for dealing with sexual abuse of minors by priests, deacons and other Church personnel
- To appoint a victim assistance coordinator, who is available for the immediate pastoral care of persons who report having been sexually abused as a minor by a priest or deacon
- To report allegations concerning child sexual abuse to civil authorities and to cooperate with the civil investigations
- To establish a review board of at least five persons, mostly members of the laity, who counsel the bishop on allegations and review local policies dealing with sexual abuse of minors

- To investigate promptly and objectively any allegation of sexual abuse of minors by a priest or deacon
- To remove offending priests or deacons permanently from Church ministry
- To prohibit the transfer of offending priests or deacons for ministerial assignment in another diocese or eparchy
- To receive necessary background information before permitting a priest or deacon to exercise ministry in a diocese or eparchy
- To protect the rights of accusers and of the accused


